Class Titles and Descriptions

Class A: Dive! Search! Recover!

Ever wonder what it's like to go deep under water? This presenter will give you an idea of what it's like, show you equipment used, and tell you how important their job is. You'll also hear about some actual search and recovery missions.

Class B: Moo-ve Over, the Animal Doctor is In

Look through the eyes of a veterinarian and discover the skills you need to become a vet.

Class C: Hot Diggity Dog!

This exciting class will teach you about electrical safety and Bill will demonstrate how to fry a hot dog on a live wire. Be very careful!

Class D: Money Does Grow on Trees

Students will learn how their money (earnings) can grow (increase) from the sale of a variety of different "agroforestry products" that can be produced from trees (or forests).

Class E: Working with Sled Dogs

Learn the importance of nutrition, training, and racing sled dogs. A hands-on experience with sled dog equipment and outdoor gear for the dog musher.

Class F: Securing our Nation's Borders with the Border Patrol

In this hands-on class, you'll learn about the United States Border Patrol and you'll even be able to handle some of the equipment used by them.

Class G: Don't Mess with Meth

Class H: EMT's Save Lives

Visit with EMT's and find out what it's really like to save someone's life. Look inside their ambulance and see the state-of-the-art equipment that could one day save you!

Class I: Greenhouse Tour and Horticulture Center

Who said you can't grow bananas in North Dakota? Take a tour of this greenhouse and be totally amazed by all the wonderful things you see! (At the request of the presenter, class capacity has been set at 15.)

Class J: All in a Day's Work in Law Enforcement

Our friends in law enforcement will be showing you items taken from individuals during searches and gathered at crimes. Don't miss this thrilling class!

Class K: High Tech Scavenger Hunt

It's part hiking, part orienteering, part scavenger hunt, and part hide-and-seek! It's as low-tech as the walking stick in your left hand and as high tech as the compact global positioning system (GPS) receiver cradled in your right. Class L: Pop Bottle Rockets

This is an exciting introduction to model building and model rocketry. No fuel is needed, so it's fun for all ages. (At the request of the presenter, class capacity has been set at 20.)

Class M: Fur Bearer Familiarization

Fur trapping offers adventure, excitement, and reward for the effort and skill put into it, as well as helping to maintain a healthy, viable wildlife population. Attend this class and learn how pelts are preserved, how habitats are managed, and view a collection of pelts.
