Step 1:	<p>Gather Information.</p> <p>--We will need the total number of students, projects, and chaperones attending, and your lunch plans.</p> <p>--We will also need parental approval for your project students to be included in any Marketplace for Kids video production. At random, we select project students to be interviewed. These interviews will be on our website and DVD following the Education Day.</p> <p>--If two or more teachers are working together, and have students from different classrooms doing projects together, or grouped together, please register as ONE classroom and provide us with both teacher names.</p>
Step 2:	<p>Group your students in groups of eight or less.</p> <p>Each group will have the <u>SAME</u> schedule. Project students <u>cannot</u> be grouped with non-project students, as they will have different schedules.</p>
Step 3:	<p>Distribute the Marketplace for Kids class offerings to each student group.</p> <p>A list of the class offerings for your Education Day is included in this kit. Each student group should select the six classes they are most interested in attending, and put them in order of preference using the class letter (i.e., D, A, F, Z, P, G). If class information is not received, your students will be assigned classes at random. We will do everything possible to make sure your students receive at least 2 of their 6 choices.</p>

Class A: How Drugs "Operate" in the Body

Class D: KidWind.

Did you know that North Dakota is the windiest state in the United States? It is! What can we do with all that wind? Wind has the power to shape the face of the earth. People use wind to sail kites, push boats and sometimes surf! We can even use wind to make electricity for entire cities. In this class we will see how we can use wind to make our lives easier. Join us to learn about wind turbines, wind farms and more! *(This class will be two class periods. At the request of the presenter, this class size will be limited.)*

Class E: Build-a-Bot. A Robot That Is!

Hurry up and gather 'round for a chance to see the coolest robots in town! Step into our robotics laboratory and learn all about robots. We'll teach you how a robot works and how you can set up a robotics team at your very own school. You'll even get a chance to touch and see a real working robot. You won't want to miss this class!

Class F: Blast Off with Biofuels.

Imagine powering a car, boat or airplane with something that you grew in your garden. Does it sound too good to be true? People do it every day with the help of biofuels. Biofuels are fuels that come from plants and other natural sources. Race car drivers use them every day and chances are so do your friends and family. This class will help you learn all about biofuels. You might be the future inventor of a super biofuel that will power the race cars of tomorrow! *(At the request of the presenter, this class size will be limited.)*

Class G: 119 Fun and Exciting Business Ideas!

Do you like to make money? Do you like to have fun? If so, this is the class for you. Making money can be exciting and rewarding if you know how to do it. Join our class and we will teach you 119 exciting things you can do to make money.

Class H: Friends of the Forest.

Trees and forests give us many products that improve our lives. We use forest products for food, building materials and paper. Selling special forest products is an opportunity to earn extra money while providing a useable product that doesn't hurt the environment. Special forest products may include food like fruits and nuts; decorative items like Christmas trees and flowering branches; craft products like bird feeders and potpourri; medicines and herbs; or woody biomass for fuel. Participants will make and take home a bird feeder made from a pine cone. *(Students will be working with peanut butter. At the request of the presenter, this class size will be limited.)*

Positive Motion is "movement with a message." Put the fun in fitness through awesome hip hop and jazz moves while learning about health, fitness, and "groovin" to your positive motion beat.

Class J: Your Dreams, Math and How to Manage Your Money!

Everyone dreams! We dream about being teachers, doctors, gamers, engineers, attorneys, business owners, farmers, movie stars, and rock stars. Your dreams will change the world! This interactive class will give you a glimpse of how to start reaching for your dreams today --- and as a bonus you will learn how simple math will help you manage your money --- forever.

Class K: YOUR Help is Wanted!

There are many different kinds of jobs. Which ones are a good match to you? Using checklists, you will interview other students for jobs and be interviewed yourself. You will compare jobs and share where you fit best in the world of work.

Class L: Tennis Anyone?

Come to this class and learn about careers in cosmetology. When you leave, you may even have a different hair color!

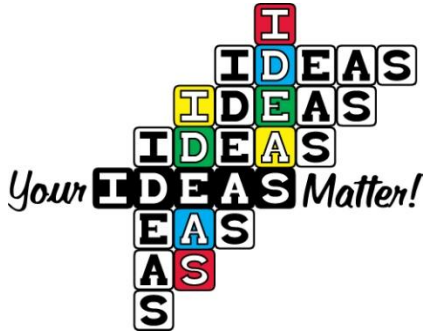
